

When Were We quickened?

A Word Study – by Leon King

2227 ζοοποιεο dzo-op-oy-eh'-o (from the same as 2226 and 4160; TDNT-2:874,290; v)

Translated in the AV as: quicken 9, give life 2, make alive 1; 12.

Why did our translators choose the English Word “quicken” to translate this Greek Verb? How is the English verb “quicken” defined? Let us consult the *Oxford English Dictionary* (OED).

OED Definition of the verb quicken: I.I Transitive senses. 1. a.I.1.a To give or restore life to; to make alive; to vivify or revive; to animate (as the soul the body).

John 5:21 For as the Father raiseth up the dead, and quickeneth <2227> them; even so the Son quickeneth <2227> whom he will.

John 6:63 It is the spirit that quickeneth <2227>; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life.

Romans 4:17 (As it is written, I have made thee a father of many nations,) before him whom he believed, even God, who quickeneth <2227> the dead, and calleth those things which be not as though they were.

Romans 8:11 But if the Spirit of him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, he that raised up Christ from the dead

shall <2227> also quicken <2227> your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth in you.

1 Corinthians 15:22 For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall <2227> all be made alive <2227>.

1 Corinthians 15:36 Thou fool, that which thou sowest is <2227> not quickeneth <2227>, except it die:

1 Corinthians 15:45 And so it is written, The first man Adam was made a living soul; the last Adam was made a quickenings <2227> spirit.

2 Corinthians 3:6 Who also hath made us able ministers of the new testament; not of the letter, but of the spirit: for the letter killeth, but the spirit giveth life <2227>.

Galatians 3:21 Is the law then against the promises of God? God forbid: for if there had been a law given which could have given life <2227>, verily righteousness should have been by the law.

1 Timothy 6:13 I give thee charge in the sight of God, who quickeneth <2227> all things, and before Christ Jesus, who before Pontius Pilate witnessed a good confession;

1 Peter 3:18 For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickeneth <2227> by the Spirit:

Translated in the AV as: quicken together with 1, quicken together 1;

Ephesians 2:5 Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us together with <4806> Christ, (by grace ye are saved;) 6 And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus:

Colossians 2:13 And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, hath he quickened together <4806> with him, having forgiven you all trespasses; 14 Blotting out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us, which was contrary to us, and took it out of the way, nailing it to his cross; 15 And having spoiled principalities and powers, he made a shew of them openly, triumphing over them in it.

3824 παλιγγενεσια παλιγγενεσια pal-ing-ghen-es-ee'-ah (from 3825 and 1078; TDNT-1:686,117; n f)

AV-regeneration 2; 2

Matthew 19:28 And Jesus said unto them, Verily I say unto you, That ye which have followed me, in the regeneration <3824> when the Son of man shall sit in the throne of his glory, ye also shall sit upon twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel.

Titus 3:5 Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration <3824>, and renewing of the Holy Ghost;

Translated in the AV as: begat again 1, be born again 1; 2

1 Peter 1:3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten <313> us again <313> unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,

1 Peter 1:23 Being born again <313>, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever.
